Special Tools and Glasses for Muddling, Serving, etc:

5-gallon water jug of the sort normally seen on top of water coolers at offices
2.5 foot, 1/2" rebar stake (optional)

Preparation

1. Wait until Labor Day night.
2. Bring out all your leftover booze and anything that might conceivably be used as a mixer.
3. Drain one or two kinds of liquor into the giant jug, along with an appropriate (if possible) or inappropriate (as necessary) mixing agent. Note: solvent and duct tape are NOT recommended mixers.
